In 1990, Muffy Clark Gill became interested in Florida's historic Seminole and Miccosukee tribes, specifically from the period dating from the 1890's to the 1990's. She researched and collected historical documents. photographs, newspaper clippings, postcards, and oral histories of the life and work of these early Florida settlers.

Informed by this accumulated wealth of intriguing historic data, and specifically the stories behind the imagers, Muffy Clark Gill began the "Florida Indian Tribes" series of paintings. exploring easy ways to give

the viewer a fresh historical perspective of an Indian tribe which continues to inhabit and impact south Florida, preserving and interpreting in a new way, an important part of its local history.

"The 20th Century Seminole Experience: Painting from the Florida Indian Tribes Series" opens at the MIHS Museum, October 2, 2012 and runs to December 27, 2012.


