
## **Marco Island Natural History Crossword**

- 4. Alligator pear (avocado)
- 5. This small fish with yellow stripes was a staple of the Calusa diet (pinfish)
- 8. Chickee roof material (pl.) (palmfronds)
- **10.** Marco Island has the second largest urban population of these threatened birds in Florida (**burrowingowl**)
- **12.** Feline likely represented in Key Marco Cat statuette (**floridapanther**)
- 14. "Flour root" in Seminole (coontie)
- **15.** Deltona Corp. designated the entire island as a sanctuary for this species in 1964 (**baldeagle**)
- **16.** Known to many pioneers as a 'curlew' or 'Chokoloskee chicken' (**ibis**)

- Small fruit used by pioneers (including Tommie Barfield) in preserves and jellies (guava)
- 2. This reptile is one of North America's (and Marco Island's) oldest living species (gophertortoise)
- 3. Summer-blooming "flame tree" (royalpoinciana)
- 5. Pouchy pod member (pelican)
- 6. Members of the 'Marco Inn \_
- Club' hooked a 'silver king' over 60 lbs. (tarpon)
- 7. Plume hunters nearly wiped this bird out in the late 1800s (**snowyegret**)
- **9.** Popular sport fish protected in Florida since 1957 (**snook**)
- 11. Warm, shallow water lover (manatee)
- Valuable source of food, hide, sinew and bone for early island residents (deer)
- 14. Marco and Caxambas factories canned these (clams)
